### **CLASS 4. DODSON & HORRELL 85CM NATIONAL AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFIER - FIRST ROUND**

**Rule 318. Single Phase. Speed 325mpm. Start Height 85cm. DRAWN ORDER**

For registered horses to be ridden by Full, Associate or Junior Members excluding any rider listed on the British Showjumping Gold League as of 31st March 2020 (assigned for the qualifying period) and any horse/rider combination listed on the British Showjumping Silver League as of 31st March 2020 (assigned for the qualifying Period). Riders who have ever competed as a team member of any Senior International Team (4\* or 5\* Nations Cup in the last 10 years, World, European Championships & Olympic Games) are not eligible. Pony Riders, Children, Juniors and Young Riders who have ever competed in Nations Cup/International Team Events and European Championships in the last five years are not eligible (excluding Veterans and Para Teams). Qualifies for: 85cms National Amateur Second Rounds. Qualifying period: 1st September-31st August inclusive.

Numbers to qualify: Those horse/rider combinations which jump clear in the first round, followed by a clear round in the jump-off, in at least five 85cm National Amateur First Round competitions held in the qualifying period will qualify to compete in the respective height classes at the National Amateur Championships. Horses which jump clear in the first round followed by a clear round in the jump off, in at least one 85cm National Amateur First Round Competition held in the qualifying period, will qualify to compete in the National Amateur 85cm Second Round competition.

**British Showjumping Boots / Leg Protection Ruling applies to this class, in accordance with Rule 102.15. Failure to comply will incur disqualification.**

### **CLASS 5. EQUISSAGE PULSE SENIOR BRITISH NOVICE FIRST ROUND / 90CM OPEN**

**Single Phase. Speed 325mpm. Start Height 90cm. DRAWN ORDER**

**Horses (or ponies in pony competitions) may compete in one section only.**

**British Novice:**

Entry qualifications: to be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members.

a) For Horses in Grade C that have not won a total of 125 points. Four Double Clears will qualify - in accordance with Rule 316.6.

b) For all horses born on or after 1 January 2017 irrespective of points. Horses will only be eligible for double clear qualification to Second Rounds if they reach the age of four years or under in the same calendar year as the British Novice Final - in accordance with Rule 316.6. Qualifies for: Senior British Novice Championship - Second Round. Qualifying period yearly 1st May - 30th April inclusive. Numbers to qualify: Those horses which jump a clear round in the first round, followed by a clear round in the jump-off, in at least four Senior British Novice First Round competitions held in any qualifying period will qualify to compete in the Senior British Novice Second Rounds, irrespective of their placings for prize money in those competitions, which will be determined by the normal Table A rules (Rule 191). Horses in the class must go in to the jump-off and go clear to gain a double clear round qualification.

If combined with an open: In Category 1 Shows and in the event of 30 starters or more the Open and the British Novice section will be split with two sets of prize money awarded.

Maximum height of jumps 115cm. Mare, Gelding or Stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail), four years old or over. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year is not eligible to compete in the Working Hunter Class.

### CLASS 26. RoR TATTERSALLS RETRAINED RACEHORSE CHALLENGE

Mare or gelding 4yrs old or over and of any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2021. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. All entries must be registered with RoR and HAVE raced in GB. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series

**The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree in August 2022**

The judge will NOT ride. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge. Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'. The class to be judged 50% jumping, 20% Style while jumping and performance and 30% awarded for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

#### PHASE 1

Jumping to be judged:

8 rustic jumps 3 foot (90cm) to 3 foot 3 inches (1 metre) with a maximum spread of 95 centimeters)

The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

10 points to be deducted for a knock down.

15 points to be deducted for a refusal.

20 points for second refusal.

Elimination for third refusal or fall or Error of Course.

#### PHASE 2

Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. (In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class)

Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes. Show to include the following movements: Walk, Trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on long rein. Total marks out of 30% for Show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

Fences for the final at Aintree can be up to a maximum of 3'6" (1.05 metre)

**1st £30 plus RoR prize, 2nd £20 3rd 10**

**RoR prizes will not be awarded to RoR qualifiers with numbers forward of two or less, however qualification for the final will stand.**

### CLASS 33. RoR AMATEUR RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER - 2022

#### Sponsored by Tattersalls

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2021. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavasson noseband. Horses should be plaited. The Series is open to AMATEURS only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration.

Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series

This class is a qualifier for the RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series FINAL.

The Judge will not ride at the qualifiers but will ride in the final.

**The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting, June 2022.**

**In addition to the prize money offered by Hanbury Countryside Show Society, RoR offer the following prizes: Rosettes 1st - 6th. Prizes - 1st £30 plus RoR Prize, 2nd £20, 3rd £10.**

**RoR prizes will not be awarded to RoR qualifiers with numbers forward of two or less, however qualification for the final will stand.**

#### Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition a person classed as amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season: Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st 2020. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

### CHAMPIONSHIP

Horses placed 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> in classes 31 to 33 are eligible to compete for the Champion & Reserve Champion Retrained Racehorse.

## HORSE SECTION RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. **HEALTH AND SAFETY:** The Organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey all signs and the instructions of the Organiser, Officials and Stewards.
2. **COVID-19 REGULATIONS:** All exhibitors and other persons admitted to the Showground shall be subject to any COVID-19 regulations applicable at the time of the Show and any additional regulations advised by the Society. Exhibitors will be notified of these prior to attending the Show.
3. **CONDITIONS:**
  - 2.1 The organisers reserve the right to eliminate or refuse any entry or limit the number of entries in any class and to cancel, merge or alter any class.
  - 2.2 All jumping classes will be run under current British Showjumping rules.
  - 2.3 The organisers will not be responsible for any accident or loss of property or otherwise arising from any cause connected with the show and it is a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the organisers blameless and shall indemnify them against any loss, damage or legal proceedings.
  - 2.4 No entry fee will be refunded in any class without the submission of a valid Doctor/Veterinary Surgeons certificate.
  - 2.5 Every exhibitor making entries for the show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and it is on this understanding only those entries are accepted.
4. **EQUINE PASSPORTS:** All horses entering the showground **MUST** have a valid equine passport with them. Inspections of passports may be carried out.
5. **EQUINE INFLUENZA & TETANUS:** Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses attending the Hanbury Countryside Show. Vaccinations certificates are subject to local risk assessments by the Societies appointed Veterinary Surgeons. The Society's Veterinary Surgeons will carry out regular checks of the horse lines. The Stewards, at the direction of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons, are empowered to require any horse or pony showing clinical signs of equine influenza to be immediately removed from the showground.

**VACCINATION PROTOCOL:** The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 – 92 days apart, a third booster between 150 - 215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an EI vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old. This Rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF and any changes will be notified via the Showing Council and ASAO websites.
6. **DISEASED ANIMALS:** Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Society against all actions, claims, proceedings and demands by any person, company or other representative body of whatsoever nature in respect of any matter, directly or indirectly connected with the bringing onto the Society's showground of any animal which may have been suffering from any contagious or infectious disease or which develops such a disease whilst on the showground and in addition the exhibitor shall pay all costs and expenses incurred by the Society in connection with any such claim. The Society's Veterinary Officers are authorised to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to or have removed from the showground any animals affected with contagious or infectious disease. The exhibitor or such animal may obtain a certificate from the Show Secretary, stating the nature of such disease or infection. The onus of proving the freedom of any such animal from contagious or infectious disease shall rest on the exhibitor of the animal concerned.
7. **BIOSECURITY:** We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times. Please remember **"BE SEEN TO BE CLEAN"**.

- 8. OFFICIALS DECISIONS:** The Committee, or officials appointed by them, shall be empowered to disqualify and demand the removal from the showground of any animal which, in their opinion, is suffering from or affected with, a contagious or infectious disease or is considered dangerous. All entrance fees for such animals will be forfeited. If an animal is deemed to be unfit for competing by the Society's appointed veterinary surgeon; they reserve the right to deny entry to the ring and can request that animal/s be removed from the showground. The Society's veterinary officer's decision is final
- 9. CONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS AND THEIR EMPLOYEES:** All persons in charge of animals will be subject to the instruction of the Society's appointed officials. Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behaviour of their employees and for the consequence of any misconduct of such employees. Should Security deem an exhibitor or their employee's behaviour to fall below that expected by the Societies appointed officials that person or persons will be escorted from the showground.
- 10. ANIMAL WELFARE:** The Society expects all exhibitors to observe best practice at all times.
- 11. APPOINTED VETERINARY SURGEON:** A Veterinary Surgeon will be available all day on the showground. If, for whatever reason, they may be required please inform a steward and they will get the vet to you. The owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of any veterinary advice and/or treatment and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.

- 12. APPOINTED HORSE AMBULANCE:** In the unfortunate event of an animal dying or being destroyed on the Showground, the owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of disposal and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.

- 13. APPOINTED FARRIER:** The farrier will be in attendance from 8.00am until 6.00pm.

- 14. PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE:** All exhibitors should ensure they have adequate public liability insurance cover.
- 15. THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.**
- 16. OBJECTION PROTOCOL:** Any objection or protest to be lodged with the Secretary within 30 minutes of the event in writing, together with the sum of £100 as deposit, such amount to be forfeited if the objection is overruled. The matter will be referred to the objection panel. Objections may not be settled on the day. Objections will be handled following the BS Rule Book.
- 17. JUDGES:** Should a Judge be unable to officiate, a substitute will be appointed. Any judge substitutions will be listed on the website and at the horse secretaries' trailer.
- 18. AGE REGULATIONS:** Horses and ponies must be over four years of age on the day of the show if taking part in ridden classes. All ages to be taken from 1st January unless otherwise stated.
- 19. ENTRY FEES:** Entry fees vary, all fees are stated in the Schedule. No VAT to be added. Receipts available on request. Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees.
- 20. PRIZE MONIES** not collected in horse rings can be collected on Show day from the Secretaries trailer; before 5.30pm. Prize money not collected at the Show will be deemed a donation to the Society.
- 21. DOGS:** Dogs are welcome, however they must be kept under control & on a short lead at all times. Please ensure all dog waste is picked up and placed in the bins provided.
- 22. STALLIONS:** Stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed on their tail and a disc on their bridle. The owner/handler must take all precautions to ensure the safety of fellow competitors and the general public.
- 23. DRESS CODE:** Grooms/Attendants appearing with animals in judging rings must be of smart appearance and in proper dress code (not jeans), with appropriate headwear.
- 24. NO LUNGEING**
- 25. HAT REGULATIONS:** Any person riding a horse/pony anywhere on the showground is to wear a correctly fitted hat and ensure the chin strap is properly fastened and adjusted. The Society

advises hats of the standard PAS 015: 1998 or 2011, VG1 01-04: 2014-12 provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked, unless otherwise stated by their appropriate governing body. Exhibitors are advised to wear a correctly fitted hard hat whilst handling horses/ponies.

**26. BODY PROTECTORS & FOOTWARE:** The wearing of a correctly fitting body protector is advised for adults and strongly recommended for under 16s. Correct and appropriate footwear with heels must be worn.

**27. TROPHIES: NO trophies will be awarded at the Hanbury Summer Show due to COVID related concerns.** Trophies will return at the 2022 Hanbury Countryside Show.

**28. CANCELLATIONS:** If the Show is cancelled due to poor weather (where the field is considered unusable by the committee) or any other reason outside the Society's control, the Society will refund the entry fee minus £2.50 to cover administration costs.

**29. DATA STORAGE:-** Information from entry forms may be stored on computer; information about results may also be published and/or provided to the Press and Breed Societies for publication. Information about exhibitors and their animals may also be provided to DEFRA, Trading Standards, Depts. of County Councils, BCMS, SAC, and others having regulatory functions as well as the Society's Veterinary, Environmental Health, Legal and Safety Advisers. The making of an entry is irrevocable consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.
